If the commitment of milk recording organisations to implement the standard is progressing well, that of manufacturers is much more fragile.

For the long term, the amount of work required for the development and the maintenance of the standard is not compatible with free voluntary contribution. New organisation, new procedures and other resources should be found before the end of 2014 to make possible the extension of the standard to more milk recording organisations, more manufacturers and more data should be designed by the end of 2014.

The definition of long term objectives (3/5 years) which is necessary to encourage milk recording organisations and manufacturers to invest to implement the standard requires to address several complex issue: scope of the standard, (only for equipment and breeding purpose), relation with official standardisation body (UNCEFACT...), benefit from using a standard...

- 2. Adress practical problems for data transfer
- 3. Establish models for data validation
- 4. Facilitate interfaces with milkmeters
