Provide science-based expertise and consensus for the global sector and be the global voice of dairy to key intergovernmental organizations





IDF FACTS AND FIGURES

SCIENTIFIC EXCELLENCE – IDF'S NINE STRATEGIC AREAS OF WORK








Challenges and opportunities with regard to animal health and welfare

- Prevalence of animal diseases with high economic impact on the dairy sector: ParaTB, Foot-and-Mouth Disease, Mastitis
- Movement & emergence of infectious diseases : Bluetongue, Rift Valley Fever etc.
- Growing pressure from consumers & NGOs on all livestock sectors
- Development of OIE & ISO animal welfare standards for dairying
